## NATIONAL OFFICE NEWS: National Tournament Reminders for Coaches and Officials

Please make sure all teams, coaches and officials are familiar with the National Tournament rules (see pages 33-43 of the *NAL® Rules and Guidelines*). In addition, please pay specific attention to the following:

- All judges' decisions are final in the National Tournament. If, during a game, a problem occurs that cannot be solved or reconciled, stop the game and immediately call the National Office at 770-998-7833. If you continue to play the game, no changes to the officials' decisions or scores can be made later in the game (see page 35 of *NAL® Rules and Guidelines*).
- If you spend time resolving problems, please be sure to check the game clock against your videoconference facility reservation. If you think you may run out of time, stop the clock and call the National Office at 770-998-7833 (see pages 35-36 of *NAL® Rules and Guidelines*). It may be possible to extend your game time, but once the videoconference equipment is shut off, we are usually not able to reconnect soon enough to finish the game in a timely manner. **BOTH TEAMS SHARE THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR WATCHING THE CLOCK.**
- Third quarter materials shall be examined prior to the game by the judges. The judges will insure that materials are equal for each team. The same rules for 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter materials apply as during regular season play (see page 20 of *NAL® Rules and Guidelines*).
- As in regular season games, third quarter scores must include comments indicating reasons for the scores given (see page 22 of *NAL® Rules and Guidelines*).
- Third quarter presentations must be videotaped (see page 39 of *NAL® Rules and Guidelines*).
- The Student Roster lists students who will play in each quarter and the order of play. Students listed on the roster must play, and must play in the order listed. (see page 34 of *NAL® Rules and Guidelines*).
- Teams should be prepared to give a short presentation about themselves, their school, community, etc. at the end of the game. This is a great way to foster camaraderie and cross-country exchange among our academic athletes.
- Remember to mail your score sheets, score cards and question cards to the National Office the day after the game (see page 43 of *NAL® Rules and Guidelines*).

These presentations deepen the experience and national exchange among our academic athletes. This year, Philadelphia's Julia R. Masterman's National Academic League® team had a presentation that included their own original music. ## Questions From the (National Tournament) Field...

Here is a question we received during the National Tournament that we thought would be of interest throughout the League. Please send any questions or comments to us at [office@nationalacademicleague.org](mailto:office@nationalacademicleague.org).

**Question:** If a student is not recognized by an official (Student raises hand and blurts out answer), especially in 4th quarter, does the student get a technical?

**Answer:** On page 36 of the *NAL® Rules and Guidelines*, the first sentence under

the "possession arrow" paragraph states "...judges must recognize a student before they give an answer." This should be handled in the following manner:

- If the team who blurts out the answer has the possession arrow, the judge should issue a warning by saying "please wait until you are acknowledged," and count the answer.
- If the other team has the possession, the judge informs the student that it is not his/her turn to answer, and recognizes the other team. Please note that

by not waiting to be recognized, you have just shared your answer with your opponent.

- In this same circumstance, if the student blurts out the answer without possession, and without being called on, and the judge says "That is correct," the question should be tossed. This follows the guidelines for judges, page 48, rule 15, "If you inadvertently state or give away the correct answer to a question, toss it and go on to a new one (follow specific quarter rules for such an occurrence)."

"NAL® provided me with an invaluable opportunity to challenge myself intellectually and engage in friendly competition. Through NAL® I learned the art of public speaking, teamwork, leadership and academic research. Before I began NAL® I was a shy person with few close friendships. NAL® brought me out of my shell for the first time and now, nearly ten years later, I am still friends with many of my teammates."

"I was a member of NAL® because it was fun, exciting, and it challenged me in positive ways. I loved that adrenaline rush in the lightning round when it was a race to buzz in first. We got to travel around and be part of a team. But NAL® did much more than keep me entertained.

"NAL® taught me about respect. There was one match where we were away at another junior high and everything was going our way. We had a solid team and we had already seen a lot of success up to that point. In a moment of teenage selfishness we messed up their bathroom and joked about it on our way back out to the remainder of the match. Our actions were totally disrespectful to the school we were visiting and reflected poorly on us as individuals and on the school and people that we represented as members of Poston's NAL® team. We were called to account for our actions and as part of our punishment, we made an apology and we were banned from competition for a while.

"I am so grateful for that early opportunity to learn that respect matters. I had not considered how my actions would reflect on myself, my team, my school, and my peers at that other school. Beyond academics, NAL® taught me that my actions have real consequences. I realized that when I was disrespectful, everyone lost. I cannot honestly say that I have shown total respect to everyone and everything since then, but I have tried my best. NAL® oriented my attitude in a direction that has enabled me to succeed in all aspects of my life.

"NAL® really helped me grow up. To this day I keep in touch with my former teammates.. I don't see them everyday anymore but that NAL® camaraderie struck a chord that will always resonate for me."
