It was great to reconnect with old friends and make new acquaintances.



We reviewed some of the major accomplishments of the NAL® this season:

- Creation of the new website, [www.nationalacademicleague.org](http://www.nationalacademicleague.org). We will continue to add information and function to this website. Please let us know if you have any suggestions.
- Update of the NAL® Question Bank® database. One of our most valuable assets, the Question Bank® can now be edited, updated, and expanded more easily.
- Input from NAL® participants regarding current curriculum and NCLB requirements. We will continue to keep our questions relevant to students' curriculum and national standards.

Thanks to our participants, we gathered invaluable feedback about how the game is being coached, judged, and played in leagues around the nation. Some of the action items that came out of the conference include:

- Make more practice questions available, including 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter topics
- Restructure the Study Book to make it more user-friendly
- Include a wider variety of NAL® awards at different price levels; provide pictures of choices
- Pilot a new 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter scoring format to allow judges to score individual presentation skills.
- Create a 'job description' for NAL® commissioners and a National Tournament checklist.
- Share ideas for improving attendance at NAL® games.
- Facilitate a clearinghouse for used equipment; share information on repair resources.



In addition, several rule changes will be circulated among commissioners for feedback and approval.

This was a great way to wrap up an exciting and revitalizing NAL® season !
